Good Friday Afternoon All,

Daddy just spoke to nurse Luc and Kimberly and is very pleased to pass on another good report. The cardiologist reviewed this morning's echocardiogram with Kimberly and remains pleased with Blake's heart functions. The PDA clamp did its job and has improved the oxygen saturation in his blood. He believes the VSD's, (Ventricular Septal Defects) or small pin holes between the ventricles, will close in time as Blake's heart grows. (no additional surgeries) Dr. Zeb is also very pleased with Blake's general health.

He started Blake back on a very, very small amount of Mommy's milk, 1 CC. Blake's bladder functions continue to work well; many diaper changes

throughout the day. The soft ocean sounds seem to be doing the trick. Blake is holding strong at 3 lbs. and with more nutrients should continue to grow big and strong.

I have to share my father/son moment with you all from last night. As I watched over his bed by myself, as his nurse and mommy had stepped out of the room for a moment, I noticed Blake moving his fingers slightly. Remember, Blake has been sedated since his surgery. As I put the tip of my pinky finger in his little palm, he suddenly gripped around my finger with a surprisingly strong grip. To my shock his oxygen saturation improved to 100% and for a brief moment he opened his eyes for me.

I feel Blake was in his own way telling me that he was doing fine Daddy and knew that I was there with him. Needless to say, I was emotionally moved to tears from the overwhelming relief of our son's strength and steadily improving health. As monumental as Mommy getting to hold Blake in her arms for the first time, this brief moment will be forever engraved in my heart.

Hope everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving, and took a few moments to cherish all that we each have to be thankful for. Kimberly and I are certainly thankful for all our family and friends' love and support as well as the wonderful doctors and nurses who are caring for our son Blake. He is such a fighter, and continues to amaze us with his will to overcome each hurdle.

Today Blake had the ultrasound of his eyes as a follow up to his first eye exam on Wednesday. Of the many possible conditions that they could have found due to Blake's infection and pre-maturity, they were relieved to not find anything like a detached retina or build-up of white blood cells. The ultrasound did show that Blake has cataracts though.

Dr. Zeb assured us that though this sounds concerning at first, that they found cataracts is much better news than other potential conditions. There

is a small chance that these cataracts could go away in time or if they remain can be remedied with surgery later. The doctors will monitor these cataracts over time and deal with them when appropriate. For now, there are more important things to focus on.

The main focus at this time is to address Blake's nutrition. More mom's milk has been ordered...and hopefully Blake will be able to digest these larger feedings and in turn gain weight and strength. This will all lead to getting him off the respirator sooner.

Today Blake weighed in at 3 lbs. 5 oz. That now takes him from the featherweight up to the light-middleweight division I'd say. Check out the latest photo to see his current size. Though Mommy doesn't want him to grow up too fast, she is happy with his growth in the past couple of weeks.

We'll continue the updates...now get back to those leftovers.

Hello Everyone,

Daddy here with another special moment to share with you all. Blake had a good day yesterday...he tolerated lying on his back much better and has continued to receive increased feedings of breast milk. The doctors are now able to slightly reduce the TPN nutrition drip (Gatorade for babies, as it is called, due to its clear yellow color). If Blake can continue to digest more and more breast milk, then the TPN can be proportionally reduced from his diet. Blake is now receiving 14 ml of breast milk every 3 hours with little to no residual.

And even better news was that he tolerated laying on his back much better than before, and when he desat-ed he was able to bring himself back up much quicker and easier than before.

Due to having a better day...our nurse Luc was able to make another surprise moment occur. This time the surprise was on Daddy. Yes after 6 weeks of bedside encouragement and love, and a momentous 'finger grip', I for the first time held Blake in my arms. Taken completely by surprise and worried that Blake was not up for the transfer...I was a bit scared to be honest. Before I knew it, though, Luc who had already been preparing for my arrival, laid my son in my arms. (OK get the tissues out)

To be able to look down at your son, seeing yourself and Mommy in his facial features, and feeling the warmth of his tiny body...every ounce of which started from the love of his parents is breath taking. I was afraid to move an inch at first, but as he showed us his strength and with Luc there to bag oxygen to his lungs...I was able to fully appreciate the gift that Luc made possible. Blake lay there with such tender innocence and purity...what a feeling! Yesterday was a big day for Daddy, I'd have to say it was a right of passage in many ways.

Luc, these two gifts that you have made happen are more valuable than any gift Kimberly and I could dream of. We will always remember these moments. Kimberly and I want you to know that we are forever grateful for your sincere care and know you will be blessed in return for all you do. Thank You.

Hello from Mommy,

So sorry I haven't sent a message, but it's been quite a roller coaster ride. Friday Chad & I stayed up all night with Blake, because he didn't have such a good night. His oxygen requirements were up and down all night. Thank God we got through that night. Sat & Sun were much better. Since Sunday the doctors have been decreasing the rate on the ventilator. They are hopefully he will be off the ventilator soon. Blake has done well with all the changes on the ventilator so far--way to go Baby!!!! I'm so surprised he has made such a come back again. He is definitely our miracle baby!!!

He is also enjoying the mommy's milk. Everyday the feedings have increased. Today the doctors are trying him on full feeds, 30cc every 3 hours. I just can't believe it. My new trick with Blake is for him to suck on my finger with a little sugar water. He loves it. (I think I enjoy it more than him). I like to do it when he is receiving the milk so he can associate feeding with sucking. It will be easier to transition to breast or bottle feeding-hopefully. Today Blake is going to have another Echocardiogram to check his ventricle defect and pulmonary hypertension. I will have to explain that later, because I have to go to work.

I love you all. Thank you so much for your prayers, they are working!! The cataracts are clearing a little and the doctors do not know why?? I know it's from the power of prayer.

Hello Everyone,

Hold on to your seats--Blake is now 4lb 2.6 oz. I can't believe it either.

The doctors are proud of Blake's growth. We will be happy to hear the staff call him chubby one of these days. One of the surgeons that placed

his central line came by to see Blake. He couldn't believe how different Blake looked from 3 weeks ago. He asked me, "Where did your baby go, because he doesn't look like the same baby?"

Yesterday we met briefly with the cardiologist and he stated the echo looked better. Meaning: the heart's contractility increased. They decided to start the nitric oxide on Saturday after the echo. We are just crossing our fingers that the echo shows good news for tomorrow (Monday). We just left Blake, because of change of shift. He looked very relaxed. He loves to kick his little feet out of the snuggly. I could not resist kissing his little feet. I am in love with another boy, my son Blake.

Today at church Pastor Fetter was so kind to use Blake's story in his sermon. It was very emotional. I was very moved by his words of love and being patient with God. We have to remember that not everyone is happy during this "Most Wonderful Time of the Year." If you are happy DO NOT hide it from your friends and family, express it.

Remember to pray for those who are less fortunate or struggling with life.
